It is our intention to auction these bats on-line, reaching out to Antonians worldwide, and direct the proceeds to the Cricket Wing. We also hope this bat will inspire young cricketers from college to work hard and join this coveted list in the future.

Our flagship event, the **Annual Dinner Dance**, is scheduled for Saturday 2nd November and would like all Antonians living in Australia to diarise this date and make an effort to come along.

It is also gratifying to note that our membership list has grown this year, following the 'push' that was initiated a few months ago. The tally now stands at around the 260 mark and would encourage all Antonians who are not on the list to come on board and be part of the Antonian community.

During my recent visit to Sri Lanka, I had the privilege of meeting a number of people closely connected with college – Fr Principal, Parent Body representatives, Cricket and Rugby Wing committee members and the ever-green Ranjith Samarasekera. There was an unanimous sense of optimism among everyone that I met, and we can enthuse confidence that the college is in good hands, taking a fresh direction towards improvement in every front.

Bridging the Religious Divide in 1980

When I was reading a recent email from Nirmal Fernando of the Kandy OBA, where he was writing about an Image building initiative by the current principal Rev. Fr. Henry, my mind went back to a similar experience 32 years ago in 1981. It was a completely different society in Kandy and at St. Anthony's back then.

Nirmal's email was about the college administration taking the initiative to organise a Sil Programme for 800 young Antonians at the Gohagoda Temple this "Vesak" on 23rd May 2013. He was writing about arrangements made for electronic media coverage for the event, and how the villagers from Gohagoda & Halloluwa volunteering to feed the young Antonians (Alms / Dana). "The chief bikkhu of the temple is extremely happy and expressed his surprise when a catholic school decided to send their children to a Sil Programme" Nirmal writes, and that the Catholic Students Federation (CSF) is taking an active role in this event by coordinating food & refreshments for the participants. This is great stuff and we had none of these in our days and we had to bring our own lunch. In fact Television was first introduced to Kandy in 1981, and that was only a couple of hours of test transmission by the national broadcaster "Rupavahini".

I thought of writing the following experience even after 32 years later on the Vesak day, as it must be told. It is good to see some practices we started are continuing.

Here's some nostalgia for you;

We were one of the first teams to organise a "Sil Programme" for Vesak at St. Anthony's way back in 1981. I believe to be the first ever in the history of St. Anthony's. Some of my contemporaries will remember the event and the drama surrounding.

I was the president of Buddhist Brotherhood of St. Anthony's in 1980/81 and Athula Daulagala was the secretary. When we came up with the idea, Rev. Fr. Stephan and few staff members supported the concept.

Some of them from memory were Mr. R.N.A De Silva, Mr. Sunil Sirisena, Mr. Galahitiyawa, Ms Srma Singharachchi, Mrs Wijesinghe (Mrs Wijesinghe was our lower school class teacher, later became the Principal at Girls High School Kandy for a while and retired as the Principal of Mahamaya Girls College, Kandy

Rest of the priest and all the matrons were extremely unhappy and objected severely.

It was a struggle to obtain college hall as we were told we cannot have the hall for this purpose. In fact matron in charge of the upper school "Tuck Shop" banned me from using the "Tuck Shop", she told me "Chaminda you are not welcome here" and I never used the upper school Tuck Shop in year twelve.

Once we received Fr. Stephen's approval we ventured Agiriya Temple in Kandy, to see "Most Venerable Uduwawala Chandananda" chief incumbent of the Dalada Maligawa at the time. We were standing in a long queue to see him (Daula and I) dressed in full school attire, college tie and prefect badges. Those days we had to dress up in full uniform, if we are representing college.

The high priest recognised the two of us from the crowd and said "Antonians come... come...". We were astonished, jumped queue and entered his office, told him that we were organising a "Vesak Sil" programme and are here to invite you to visit College for a sermon. He was surprised, "St. Anthony's is organising a Vesak Sil programme, must be change in time" he said".

The Vesak day is almost upon us. A simple idea that began in 1981 lives on in St. Anthony's.



He picked up the phone and rang few other monks in Kandy and told them to assist us in every way. I asked the Sadu, "How did you recognise us"? He said "Son I studied at St. Anthony's until year 5 and then gave up schooling and told my father (appachchi) that I wanted to be ordained as a Buddhist Monk. That was my beginning

We then went to see Gatambe Temple Chief Monk "Most Venerable Labuduwe Siridhamma", accepted our invitation with no hesitation. He then called Mahamaya College and cancelled his appointment for the same day in front of us. He cancelled his Mahamaya Girls Sil programme invitation, and instead came to college. Such was the support we received and when you think of it now, it is unbelievable.

These were very powerful monks, who were advisors of Mrs. Bandaranayake, J.R. and Mr. Premadasa at the time. They all decided to visit college. As the news spread, we had people from Katugastota Town gathered outside college hall to listen to their sermons on that Sil day in 1981.

A simple idea became a massive event and that's why some of us still remember these events with fondness today.

This experience of mine is penned with no animosity towards the staff of St. Anthony's administration who did not support us at the time.

I wanted to share what we were able to achieve then as teenagers and to share the story, since it seems so relevant in today's world.

We still admire and cherish the values what St. Anthony's has given us wholeheartedly. We Antonians, learned to accommodate and treat everyone as equal. There were no issue with caste, creed, language or religion amongst the us and I believe it continues to this day.

College benefits from all the funds raised at this event and we could not make a success of the dance without your support.

The Beginnings of the Old Antonians Social Club Australia

Most Antonians migrated to Australia in the late 60s and early 70s and most of them had settled in Melbourne. Majority of these Antonians met in the Eastern Suburbs of Melbourne. During the late 1960's it was Ron Barber who organised some day excursions for Antonians in Melbourne.

Then a memorable event comes to mind. It was the sports day and barbeque held at Wattle Park in Warrigal Road, Burwood in 1974. The main feature of the day was the keenly contested softball cricket match, which brought back some of the atmosphere of the games played in Sri Lanka with cheering, singing and a lot of drinking.

Another occasion, was when Antonians from the Western suburbs played those from the Eastern suburbs in seven-a-side basketball games in Melton. The day ended with the wives playing a mixed softball cricket match, much to the delight of the cheering Husbands. Some of the Antonians from the Western suburbs were Deryck Barthelot, Michael & Louis Macky, the Goonaratne brothers Freddy, Paddy, Gerry and Merry, Patrick Van Ryke, Robin Duff Tytler; those from the Eastern suburbs were Ron Barber, Barney Daniels, Annesley Dias, Desmond Macky, Andre Titus, Basil Hyde, Chris Drieberg, Tony, Mark and Hans Schrader, Mike Corteling and Leyrissse Vanderwert. Other stalwarts who have frequented cricket matches and social functions have been the late George Kehl, Noel Templer, Tony Hayward, Reggie Barber and Fred Rode.

Nothing seems to have happened about the formation of a club until a visit to Sri Lanka and the inevitable "pilgrimage" to College by Tony Schrader in August 1980. This was a few years after College was taken over by the government, and Fr Stephen Abraham expressed the plight the College was in financially in relation to sport. To send the College cricket team to Colombo for one match alone cost Rs.1000, which the College could ill afford. On hearing this, Tony was really fired up. On his return to Melbourne he contacted several Antonians I had already arranged for Alston Koch and his Band Dark Tan and Roger Menzies', Band from Sydney to play at a dance in Melbourne. So we decided to call it the Old Antonian Nite, in November, 1980. The chief Guest at this dance was Charlie and May Bayley.

Most of the "Old Boys" rallied round to the call with Gordon Cooray, Maurice Barsenback, Rodney Kehl, Bertram Pereira and Percy Madawela giving good support. Many members still recall jovially how Maurice Barsenback, late at night, would telephone his many friends cajoling support - but this was done in his boss' time!

The first meeting was held at Gill's and my home. Yvonne made gothambas and the other ladies the curries. The men had to contribute \$2 as membership and thus began the club.

A second meeting was organised at Tony Schrader's home in Dingley on the 18th January, 1981, when 12 attended and 5 apologies were received. A.C.M.Lafir, the first Antonian to play cricket for Sri Lanka on his first visit to Australia, was among the guests. The committee elected for 1981 was Tony Schrader (President), Merry Guneratne (V President), Chris Drieberg (Secretary), Jackie Robertson (Asst Sec), Deryck Barthelot (Treasurer), Maurice Barsenback (Asst Treasurer) and Desmond Macky (Hon Auditor). The other Antonians present were Ralph Barthelot, Errol Van Culenberg, Basil Hyde, Gordon Cooray, Andre Titus and Rodney Kehl. It should be stated that the start of the club was due to efforts in various ways by all present at the meeting.



A constitution was to be drawn up by Tony Schrader and it was to be presented to the First Annual General Meeting to be held on the 15th Nov.'81.

Just like the Tsunami, the second wave of Committeemen came along to do a great job, the likes of Merrick Poulter, Leyrissse Vanderwert and Robin Koelmeyer. Robin has still not taken a break from being in the committee.

Two highlights come to mind during the early years of the club. The first was the visit by the Principal of the College, Fr Stephen Abraham during a short say in Australia. The second was the visit, also in 1981, by the Honourable Mr A.C.S Hameed, the Sri Lankan Foreign Minister, an old boy of the College, and Mrs Hameed. He spent some hours with the Old Boys, reminiscing old times, classmates and the Tamarind Tree.

We also hosted two Principals of our College on two memorable events in their lives. Fr. Stephen Abraham celebrated 25 years as a priest with us and Fr. Theadore Robinson celebrated 50 years as a priest. The Antonians here in Melbourne funded both celebrations and enjoyed the day with each of them separately.

The success of this first dance at the Moorabbin Town Hall and all the subsequent functions are well known. In the old days we started the year off with a Children's Christmas Party. We had a Curry Nite during the year and even a food fair. The cost of a Dance ticket was \$10 with a caterer in attendance and people bought their own food. The Curry Nites were totally catered for by the wives and at the Food Fairs we brought the food and most of it was bought by us the organisers. We did an amazing bus trip to Adelaide and we frequently made bus trips to the Pokies across the boarder, thanks to Maurice and his bus mates. The credit for these must go to the annually elected office bearers and the committees. From observation, the office bearers each year have taken their duties seriously and leave nothing unattended. The loyalty of their families and staunch supporters made their task a lot easier.



Most members are well aware of the help the OBA is rendering locally and to college in Kandy. Over the years we have sent college ties, college tie pins, cricket balls and even a roller-mower for the cricket pitch and Marlon in his previous Presidency donated covers for the pitch. We donated a house for a Minor Staff member in Fr. Stephen's 25th anniversary as a priest. In the early years we even paid for the services of Owen Mottau to coach the College cricket team. In our schools 150th year we donated \$10,000 to College and recently we have totally refurbished the College Hall. What's more, this year we have made a commitment to fund the college Cricket Wing, which was established to help foster cricket in college and hopefully will produce more international stars and renowned cricketers for St Anthony's College.

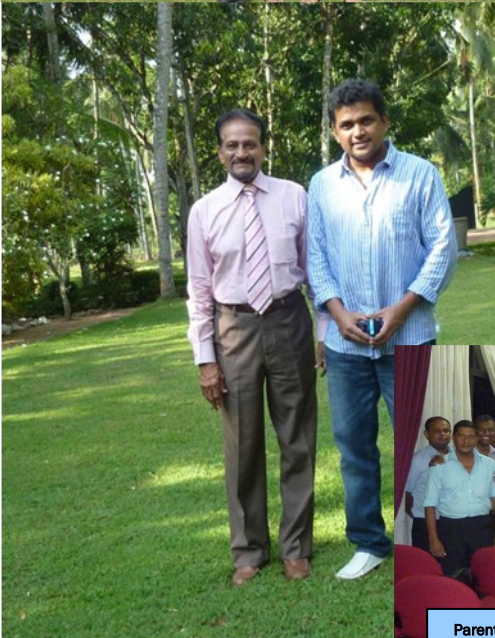



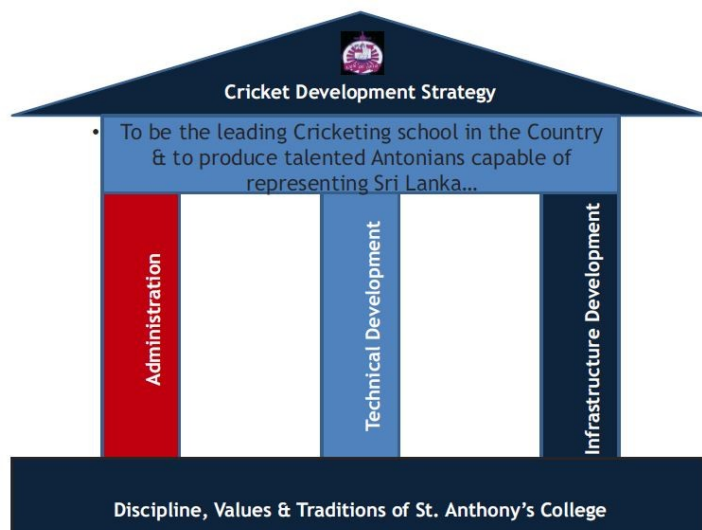

The Old Antonian Cricket Wing



The Old Antonians' Cricket Wing (OACW) was established in the year 2000, with the objective of improving the standard of Cricket at SACK. We all know the glorious legacy of our Cricket from 1950s, to the 70s, 80s & the early 90s. Antonians dominated in Cricket during this era and were among the best five schools. We produced 9 School Boy Cricketers & many represented Sri Lanka starting from Mahesh Gunathilake, Bernard Perera, Marlon Von Hagt, Ruwan Kalpage, Piyal Wijetunga & of course, the great Muttiah Muralidaran after Sri Lanka gained test status. But since mid-90s, the standards deteriorated tremendously & we lost our ranks among the best schools in Cricket. It was noticed that this was due to many reasons; mainly financial & technical support on which most other schools invest heavily.

Contribution to SACK Cricket

Over the past 12 years, the OACW with the support of few generous Old Antonians was able to support cricket at SACK. Some of the major contributions were,

- Paying Salaries to Cricket Coaches
- Sponsoring Meals, Accommodation & Travelling for Cricketers
- Supporting on Cricket equipment
- Introduction of the Cricket Academy to harness young talent
- Organize Cricket Camps & coaching sessions with expert coaches

Even though OACW had the struggle of getting the support of School Administrators in the past, we didn't give up on our efforts & continued to support Antonian Cricket.

The Future

With School Cricket arena getting more competitive, with new Technology & support elements coming in to place, the OACW see the need of further strengthening the support in future. One of the major Short/ Medium Term Objectives is to 'win the 100th Big Match in 2016'. Going beyond we intend to work on to, "Be the leading Cricketing school in the Country & to produce talented Antonians capable of representing Sri Lanka by nurturing the young talent by providing them with proper cricketing know how & facilities, while developing performance & behavior to be the best in the country..."

We have identified the following aspects as our key strategies for the future.

- Discipline, Values & Traditions,
- Administration,
- Technical development &
- Infrastructural Development

The presentation attached herewith will provide more details on what we intend to do under these areas. We have had discussions with many prominent Old Antonians' who are eager to lead these areas in order to take it to the next level. Further, it is encouraging to see the support & blessings of the new Principal Rev. Fr. Henry Wijeratne OSB & the POG Rev. Fr. Araliya Jayasundara OSB which will further strengthen our efforts. And we are confident that together we can make a difference.

Murali taking the lead in 2012

It indeed was heartening to see Murali taking the lead in uplifting the standards of Cricket in 2012. He organized a meeting in August 2012, attended by over 100 Old Antonians where he further emphasized the importance of all Old Antonians, cricket lovers & well-wishers joining hands to improve cricket at SACK. He brought in the concept of a Cricket Fiesta to rally Antonians around the flag & proposed a membership drive, where all Old boys can be a part of.

Cricket Fiesta 2013 & Membership Drive

We were able to successfully organize the 'Antonian Cricket Fiesta' on the 16th of February at P. Sara Stadium. Over 450 Antonians, family members & friends attended this event where over 300 Old Antonians battled on the field on a 6-a-side Soft Ball Cricket Tournament.
